The North Country National Scenic Trail was created by an act of Congress in 1980. Designated a premier hiking trail, similar to the Appalachian Trail, it links outstanding scenic, natural, recreational, historic, and cultural areas in seven of our northern States.

The East end of the trail is in Crown Point, New York and extends West to Lake Sakakawea, North Dakota where it joins the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail.

It appears the final length of the trail will approach about 4,200 miles with close to 1,700 miles completed so far.

The National Park Service administers the trail in cooperation with all levels of government as well as private interests. The North Country Trail Association is a nonprofit organization that works closely with the National Parks Service to build, maintain, promote, and protect the North Country Trail. It is a volunteer organization numbering more than 2,800 members.
